Honor your father and mother so you may live long in the land the Lord your God has given you.

Exodus 20:12

Sermon Outline:

- 1. Even good parents have gaps and limits.
- 2. Free people honor their mother and father.
- 3. It's impossible to love God without loving your neighbor.
- 4. No one in Egypt was treated with honor or respect.
- 5. Honor does not mean to show affection or feeling, but a decision to treat them with dignity, courtesy, and loyalty to their best interests. To honor means to see yourself as part of something bigger than yourself.
- 6. In Egypt and America older people are discarded, but God says not to forget them. Their worth is not based on their usefulness, but in the fact they are made in the image of God.
- 7. Honor doesn't mean blind obedience.
- 8. Honor often means to forgive our parents.

Forgiving doesn't mean:

- Forgiving what someone has done.
- There are no consequences to what others have done.
- You no longer feel the pain of grieving.
- Reconciliation.
- Things will be as they once were.
